Much has happened with the Crumley Archives since our last newsletter!

The Crumley Archives has been looking for a new home since Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary moved in January of 2025 to the campus of Lenoir-Rhyne University in Hickory, North Carolina. After many months of uncertainty, investigation, exploration, evaluation - and some twists and turns worthy of a dramatic novel - the Crumley Archives has finally begun its move.

On August 19, 2025, the administrative offices of the Archives moved onto the campus of Newberry College in Newberry, South Carolina and into the Dufford House. Built in 1910, the house was the boyhood home of Dr. William Dufford, who has worked most of his lifetime of 90 years to advance the cause of civil rights and social justice in South Carolina.

Newberry College has proven an incredibly gracious host and has welcomed us into their community. We are grateful for their vision and their sense of partnership in a shared mission.

UPDATE ON THE UNSUNG DOCUMENTARY

UNSUNG A CHRONICLE OF BLACK LUTHERANS

The Archives has been in the process of developing a film documentary series on Black Lutherans in the South for the past two years. The documentary is entitled Unsung: A Chronicle of Black Lutherans in the South. To date we have completed the first episode on South Carolina. In late May we were able to show the first episode to about 60 people at the SE Synod Assembly in Columbus, GA, at the invitation of Bishop Strickland. The completed episode is now accessible on the Archives website for anyone who would like to view it.

The second episode in the documentary will feature the rich but largely unsung story of Black Lutherans in Alabama. At its assembly in late May, the Southeastern Synod saw a trailer of the interviews we have filmed in Alabama. We expect to complete this episode by the end of October. It will feature stories of Rosa Young and the parochial school approach that was a centerpiece in the mission and outreach of both the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod and the American Lutheran Church in the first half of the 20th century. It also will cover the period of the civil rights movement in Montgomery in the mid-fifties and the Lutheran presence there.

The third episode will deal with the history of Black Lutherans in Georgia. We have completed the filming of oral interviews but have not done editing and compilation for this episode. Our goal is to have the third episode available by spring 2026.

The fourth episode will focus on the story of Black Lutherans in the Virgin Islands - another story that is not widely known and largely unsung. Our target is to do the filming of oral interviews in the winter of 2026; but plans are

still in process at this point. The good news is we have funds for this episode.

When additional funds become available, we intend to do similar episodes for both the Florida-Bahamas Synod and North Carolina. These future episodes do not have definite plans yet. All episodes once completed will be accessible on the Archives website. •
