She gave evidence that her hopes were bright and her faith strong, and she leaned upon the arm of Jesus and trusted on Him for salvation. Her country and severely she went down to the grave, like the setting of a summer's sun. A few years previous to her last illness, she confessed her Saviour before the world, and was confirmed by the laying on of hands, lived the life of a Christian, was attentive to the means of grace, and delighted in the worship of the sanctuary. Often has her voice been heard in praise and thanksgiving—that voice, now hushed in death, we will hear no more on these low grounds. In MEMORIAM.—Mrs. Caroline Bookman
